## **How One Mega-Yacht Captain Team Builds**

As the new season approaches and fresh crew members are recruited, mega-yacht captains sometime like to observe certain initiation rites. One such captain explained how he will instruct a novice deckhand to assist in "tuning the radar". This involves wrapping the deckhand in aluminum foil, fashioning a matching conical foil hat and sending him or her out into port on a paddleboard with a paddle similarly wrapped in the silver foil.
